# **GOD'S CALL *CAN* BE FULFILLED !**

**I** BELIEVE THERE IS AN ANSWER to every one that carries the call of God on their lives. God does not call people who are unable to fulfil what He asks of them. Therefore there has to be ways that all of us can have the joy of obedience to the purposes of God that sees all concerned very satisfied with the results. God's call can be fulfilled! This article is written as honestly and sensitively as possible in order to help encourage those who feel that their negative circumstances and experiences of the past have robbed them of the plan and purposes of God being fulfilled in their lives. Christian, we want you to know that there is "light at the end of the tunnel"; that life does not have to pass you by because of negative and hurtful experiences you pass through. Therefore this is written so that you can know we identify with you – and you with us – so together we can be encouraged to fulfil the purposes of God for our lives.

## Our Personal Testimony:

**J**ean and I have been in Christian ministry for over 43 years. All in all, we have experienced some very good years in the service of Christ and have a wonderful ministry established that impacts thousands in many nations. Yet we have had our difficult times too. In the 1980's and then again in 1998-1999 we passed through some very deep waters – waters which few Christians seemed to understand and which left us feeling “isolated and alone” in our walk with God. There were times when we felt like giving up the call of God on our lives and settling for something far less than what we have come in to today. While these times are often caused by those over us not seeing or knowing the purpose of God for our lives – or through personal biases and bigotry - we have discovered that God is far Bigger than anything man can say or do to us, especially when in our heart-of-hearts we want the will of God to be done. These times are also made worse by the fact that we often do not know God's next step for us. We get so caught up in what people are saying (which is often contrary to the will of God for us) that we somehow fail to see or hear what God is wanting of us. It is a fact that there is also a part of us that wants to please others - we want to be loved and accepted by the rest of the body of Christ, but when you feel forsaken, it is hard to see where your next step should take you. Jean and I have experienced those times.

**B**ecause we did not know from God where our next step should be, we took time out from ministry for the last few months of 1999 to try to discover what God wanted of us. We had felt “let down, misunderstood and even betrayed” by those we felt should have known better. Out of it we discovered God used those things

to bring about a death and “crucifixion” in us that most likely could not have come any other way. We coined a saying, “There can be no resurrection until first there is a death or a crucifixion.” No one enjoys dying, and a crucifixion is worse still! Those times are made much more difficult because it happens to us through people we have grown to love and trust – and that really hurts! (It is very likely that we expect far more of those people than we should, which then adds to the frustrations and disappointments.) But now, of course, we thank God for what has happened to us, because it has been the very means of releasing us into that which we are presently enjoying. It is far better than anything we have known in the past. God does allow the “death and crucifixion” process to happen to us, as He can always see further ahead and beyond where we can see. In this process we know that only God can get the glory! We can rise again! YOU can rise again too! You can fulfil the call of God in your life!

## **GOD Spoke:**

**I**t is interesting to note (as we look back) that God spoke to me when I went outside my usual Christian circles, amongst those who did not know what we were going through. After ministering to a group of Presbyterian Elders one weekend near the end of 1999, I asked them if they would pray for me as we had some major decisions to make. They did, and during that prayer time one dear elder spoke out and said, “Rodney, I’ve got this crazy word for you. It doesn’t make sense to me, but I will share it with you anyway. I feel God is showing me that you do not belong in a local church, because He wants you flowing in all churches. God wants to release you to be free from local church involvement so as to bless many

more people in the wider body of Christ . . .” The impact of that word to me broke a mindset – a mindset that had kept me faithful to the local church all my Christian life. I had always believed that every ministry has to work out from the local church and, as we did not have confirmation in our hearts to move to any other church from our last pastorate, we struggled with making a decision for our future. But once that mindset was broken, we knew there were more options open to us. Very quickly the Holy Spirit spoke to us, “*I want you to simplify your life-style, resign from all your church and denominational responsibilities, and trust Me with your future. If you trust Me with your future, I’ll show you what I can do for you. I want you to live by faith and trust Me.*” After many years of having the security of a church salary, this was a new challenge. It had to be a faith step, because when I looked in my diary for the year 2000, I had only three invitations in it. We also had not one person guaranteeing financial support of us. At that point no one knew what we had decided anyway. In spite of the natural outlook looking rather bleak, we obeyed God and made the decision in our hearts to trust God with our future. **We kept that secret to ourselves for 10 days, yet in that 10-day period I received 20 invitations from six nations to go and preach!** Our decision to *obey God first* released something in the spirit realm and ushered us into a whole new season in God. We stepped into “resurrection life.” The last three years have been quite marvelous, as God has opened many doors around the world for us.

## **We Obeyed Our Conviction:**

**W**e also obeyed our conviction and resigned our positions and membership from the local church we attended and the national



movement we belonged to. (I am not advocating that those who read this do the same. You have to hear from God for you and do what He asks of you.) Obedience means we have to take some difficult and even drastic steps in order to see God released in our lives. We felt we needed to enter 2000 and beyond being “free in the Lord” to follow His guidance in our lives. In doing that, the doors have truly opened and we’ve been kept very busy in the work of the Lord ever since.

**B**efore making that decision we had no idea how God would supply for us financially. “The GFM” Ministry had never ever been in the position to pay salaries, so we certainly were called to trust God for our provision. Please don’t ask me how it all happened, but **in our first year of living by faith and trusting the Lord, the giving into “The GFM” Ministry almost tripled!** We were amazed and blessed. And it has continued to come in. **We have done so much more in the last three years than we’ve done in the past 10-15 years!** We have published “The School Of The Holy Spirit” Manual (in English and Italian) and published two new books, “You Can Measure Your Love For God” (in English and Italian) and “The Prophetic In The Exodus” (in English); also a booklet entitled, “Do You Know And Understand The Prophetic Foundation Of Your Life And Your Church?” We have many requests for our books to be translated and published in other languages. The Bible Correspondence Courses from our Hamilton office have increased over 600% and a fine, dedicated team is ministering to many people internationally. Our Prophetic Conferences, International Training Schools, Equipping Station (training people in the prophetic), public meetings, GFM magazine, literature and E-Mail/Internet ministries are all continually growing. Even though I have been privileged to have over 20 books and manuals printed, Jean and I take no money from the sale of any of them. The proceeds all go

back into the furtherance of the ministry. We are called to trust Him – and prove Him - and it is certainly far better than anything we’ve experienced in the Christian life before. God is so good when we can simply trust Him to do what He wants to do. **God wants to be GOD in our lives, but far too often we are “bound to a system” of a natural mindset that limits God in providing for us the way He wants to.** I have traveled more than ever to more countries than ever, yet the money has always come in. My diary is full and the Lord is using us to impact individuals (even in high government positions) and whole churches through the ministry of the prophetic He has given us. **We have found a key to releasing God is to know His voice and do whatever He asks us** (John 2:5). And that, unfortunately, does not always please your fellow Christian friends.

## **The Positives Outweigh the Negatives:**

**I** have shared with you some of the positives of what has come out of our decisions to obey the Lord. Realistically, there have also been a few negatives that we have experienced. Mis-understanding, for example! The biggest has been the cost of a number of friends who either did not understand our hearts, in some cases did not trust us, or who could not see that we needed to make such “drastic” decisions, or do such things. We have felt all that keenly. However, the truth is that the positives have far outweighed the negatives. Today we have a greater number of new friends, our ministry is impacting as never before and – THE BEST IS YET TO COME! The prophetic words over our lives are for greater breakthroughs yet in the times ahead. We are eagerly stepping into our future,

knowing that the call of God can be fulfilled, God does not forsake us and He wants the very best for each one of us. Sometimes that calls for some radical decisions to be made. **The thing is, make sure that you are hearing from God, and then be committed to obeying Him. It is in our trust and obedience of Him that releases Him to set up our future for us, to make us secure in the promises and purposes of God for our lives in the 21st century. God is FAR BIGGER than any person, and He guides us through into His will when we are willing to follow.**

**W**hile we are no longer pastoring a church (in the official sense of the word) we are actually pastoring more people than we ever did before – right around the world. We are also very privileged to be involved in the training and releasing of other people into their prophetic ministries, many of whom have struggled for years to find their niche in a local church. Our guess is that right now there are most likely more Christians who love the Lord Jesus who are not committed to a local church (for numbers of reasons), yet still have a place in the purposes of God today. There is a need for whole new creative ministries to arise that will be very fruitful outside the church (as we know it).

## **Remember the Bible Greats:**

**W**hen we think of the Bible characters who accomplished mighty things in God, it is very likely that they would have really struggled to find acceptance in many of our churches of today (generally speaking) because of their past deeds. For example:

- **Abraham** fathered an Ishmael to his housekeeper Hagar (certainly

not acceptable in ministry today), yet he became the father of the faithful – the obedient to God! (Genesis Chapters 16, 17 & 22).

- **Moses** was a murderer and a fugitive for 40 years (yet became one of God’s greatest leaders and deliverers of the people) (Exodus 2 & 3).
- **Joshua** was very radical, commanding city walls to fall over and the sun to stand still (could be very embarrassing to explain) (Joshua 6 & 10:12-15).
- **Elijah** was such “a loner” nobody ever seemed to know where he was (not very useful in organizing the church roster) (1 Kings 17) – he was also prone to the fear of woman (1 Kings 19).
- **Elisha** was totally unpredictable in the presence of cheeky, unruly young people. When 42 of them gave him cheek one day, saying, “*Go up you baldhead,*” he cursed them in the name of the Lord. Two lady bears came out of the wilderness and mauled them! (2 Kings 2:23-25). So he would not be allowed to function wherever there were children (at least without constant supervision – and who would want that responsibility?) – yet he was a double-portion man of the Holy Spirit!
- **Jonah** was unacceptable. He went right outside the boundaries of the Jewish traditions of the day and went to Nineveh preaching repentance to a foreign people (something unheard of). He became the first foreign missionary, was the sign of Jesus, and a prophet of knowledge before his time – and got rejected by the Jews, and “branded” by the Christians as being a backslider!! (See Book of Jonah). Amazing, isn’t it?

- **John the Baptist** came in the spirit and power of Elijah with a radical new message and way of doing things. He upset all the “comfort zones” within the existing church of the day. The religious people accused him of having a demon! (Matthew 11:18). He introduced water baptism by total bodily immersion that would have shocked many and sent them searching their scrolls. Because of the large numbers of people being baptized, John must have spent most of his time in the Jordan River baptizing and preaching to the people on the banks. Yet he revolutionized the people of his day. His power and impact was such that the people went out to him, and were obedient to the “new thing” he brought (Mark 1:1-11).
- **Jesus** was very unorthodox too. He spat on the ground, made clay of it, then rubbed it into a poor blind man’s eyes and healed them (not very mannerly, nor hygienic either)(Mark 8:22-25). He also broke up the market day stalls in the temple (Matthew 21:12-13).
- **Peter** was far too inconsistent in his daily walk – so “up and down” – that one never knew what frame of mind he would be in. He could go from receiving a revelation of Jesus to rebuking Jesus in a short space of time (Matthew 16:13-23).
- **Paul** carried the revelation of God for the New Testament believers, but it seems many times he felt very alone and had few friends in which to trust (2 Timothy 1:15 & 4:9-18).

And so we could go on. How interesting that the above “nation changers” all got more readily received after they were dead and gone, than when they were alive. They all learned to rise above

their weaknesses, their failures and their setbacks, and to discover that God had a greater plan for them than “missing the mark” as a result of earlier actions, or the opinions and rejections of people. **And so must we.**

**T**hings haven’t changed much in these days. There is a real need for forgiveness, acceptance and understanding to be shown toward those with the unfulfilled call of God on their lives. God gives us a second chance (and more!) – so we should do the same to others.

## **The Call of God is Tested:**

**R**emember, all the above-mentioned people were tested in their callings. Moses, Elijah, John the Baptist, Jesus and Paul all spent years in the preparations of God before being released to fulfill their destiny and calling in God. Think also of Joseph, when as a young man he dreamed dreams, only to have them rejected by his own brothers. That caused him about 13 years of suffering and rejection, yet through it all God continued to bless and prepare him for that which was to come – he became their very means of salvation from a massive famine that crippled the nations of that area (Genesis 37-50).

**T**here are times when God takes us through things in order to “break us out of the mold” of what we are in, so we can step into something entirely new and much more fruitful to His glory.

- **Are you willing for that to happen?** (Remember the potter’s house – “*He made it again*” - Jeremiah 18:1-6).

**It is my conviction that all those Christians who carry the call of God on their lives *can still fulfill that calling on their lives.*** The fact that right now many are feeling like we did, with seemingly nowhere to go, and seemingly no future in the ministry, does not alter God's mind. If we can rise above the hurts, the disappointments, the criticisms and rejections of the past, we can still HOPE IN GOD! (Psalm 43). **We can still accomplish that which God promised us in the past.** We can “rise again” **in the now** by “letting go” all the negatives of past hurts, rejections and disappointments. It is not about “what happened yesterday,” **but what are we doing with our life NOW?** God's call and purpose upon our lives is far greater than any mis-demeanours that may have happened to us in the past. Be encouraged right now to see that God has not changed His mind on you. He loves you just the same. He wants you to know the power of His love and commitment to you – in spite of yourself – so you can rise and accomplish His will in and through your life. Be sure to repent of any self-pity!

## **ARCHIPPUS:**

**L**et's learn from the life of Archippus. His name is recorded only twice in the Bible, yet we see some important things for us to learn from him. The two verses are:

**“And say to Archippus** (meaning “horse chief”; chief groom” or “master of the horse”), ***Take heed to the ministry which you have received in the Lord, that you fulfil it***” (Colossians 4:17, KJV).

**“And to Apphia our sister, and Archippus our fellow soldier [in the Christian warfare], and to the church (assembly that meets)**

*in your house*” (Philemon 2, AMP).

“Fellow soldier” means: “one serving as a soldier of Jesus; one who works in conjunction with another, or together with another.” Archippus was told he had received a ministry **“in the Lord.” His responsibility was to fulfil it!**

- **There is a huge gap between “*the receiving*” of a ministry and “*the fulfilling*” of a ministry!** Many talk of “their ministry,” but few go on to effectively “fulfil their ministry.” **We need to know we have already “*received it,*” so now it is up to us to “*take heed*” to it, to develop, nurture, guard, release, and fulfil it!**

If we take the meaning of the name “Archippus,” we see it has to do with the grooming and preparation of horses. In the natural realm that is a very important and responsible position. The chief groom has to know how to handle the horses in his care. He has to work to a timetable of having the horses at their very best for and on the day of a show, a sale, or a race. If the horse is for sale, and it is not in the best possible condition, the price will be lower. The chief groom’s job can be “on the line” (he also has other men working under him, so he must get it right). It involves discipline, timing, labouring in all kinds of weather, training the horses, getting and keeping them fit. The groom has to know what he is doing. He carries large responsibilities and is accountable to the horse’s owner or owners. It takes commitment – and lots of it. He is working for another’s reward. **In the Christian ministry it is exactly the same.** We are working for the Lord Jesus Christ, not for some mere earthly reward, but for all eternity. Our first responsibility is to Him. We are answerable to Him. It means day after day, week after week, month after month, year after year of



faithfully attending to that which He has called you to do. It is not a drudgery - it is an adventure, an exciting adventure with Jesus when He is kept alive and fresh in our hearts. Every new contact is an exciting new opportunity in Jesus!

In Philemon 2, we see that Archippus was a “*fellow soldier*.” He could march (in step), take orders (from the Boss and those over him), strategize, fight, protect and work with others. He was not only good working at fulfilling his individual calling (Colossians 4:17) but he was also good at being a team person. He carried spiritual responsibility of a house church. He was a leader! **Will you be an “Archippus” for Jesus and fulfil your ministry, which you have received in Him?**

## **DON'T GIVE UP! GOD'S CALL CAN BE FULFILLED!:**

**T**o those of you who are still in “the wilderness” of unfulfilled dreams of the call of God, I encourage you not to give up hope. **Don't allow other people to destroy your dream, your future and destiny in God because they have not (as yet) seen the potential within you. It is God Who has called you, and, if you will allow Him to bring you through, He will open the right doors at the right time for you to step through.** Lift your eyes higher than the natural, logical realm. **You must be able to hear and see in the realm of the Spirit of God. Be filled and refreshed in the Holy Spirit and stir those gifts that are already within you (2 Timothy 1:6-7). God has not changed His mind on you! He has called you and He remains faithful to that call.** Allow Him His proper place in your heart, life, marriage, family, occupation,

church, etc., and you will see what He can do for you. Prepare your heart for greater things to come. ***“The Lord has need of YOU!”*** (Mark 11:1-11). Turn your disappointments into “His” appointments! Be encouraged!

**A**sk yourself some honest, heart-searching questions, and be prepared to give yourself (and others) some honest answers:

- What really did cause you to stop pursuing the call of God?
- Is it someone else you are blaming, i.e. a Christian leader, church, a knock-back, a rejection, a failure, a wife or a husband?
- Are you over re-acting to someone else’s actions?
- Are you blaming God for what has not come to fruition?
- Are you expecting too much of others?
- Is there anything you feel you can do to help restore any broken down relationships? We cannot afford to let hindrances from the past to rob us in the present and so destroy our hope for the future.
- What is your present attitude toward God?
- What is your present attitude toward His claims and call on your life?
- Do you really know the call of God for you? What it involves, etc.? How will you know unless you can share your heart with others who believe in you and your calling?
- What decisions or actions do you need to make in order to re-activate the desire to fulfil the call of God on your life?
- Have you faced your own insecurities and fears that you will fail again? We have to learn to trust God’s strengths rather than our own weaknesses.
- What do you think should happen before you are willing to try again?

**B**e prepared to make the decisions that will help you to fulfil your dream and calling in God. Be very honest with yourself. If you're married, spend a lot of time sharing your hearts together (with your spouse) about what you really believe is God's will for your lives and future. The clearer you are about it between yourselves, the easier it will be to know the right door when it opens, and the decisions that need to be made. I also encourage you to seek out those Holy Spirit filled leaders and Christians who believe in you and the call of God that is upon you. It is important to have that kind of support – **you have a future in God to fulfil!** It is also important to be in fellowship with other like-minded Christians so you can grow in confidence, vision and purpose, which all help you to fulfil that which God has purposed for you. Don't just wait for everything to come to you – **you must seek in order to find.**

## WHAT ABOUT YOUR FINANCIAL SUPPORT?

**T**his is a big issue that has to be faced by every person stepping into full-time Christian service - finances. Are you being realistic about this? There are only a limited number of full-time paid positions available in churches. Most other ministries – whether overseas or local – will require you to raise most (if not all) your own support base. What assurance and guarantees can you give your family that you will be able to provide for them? Financial support comes in a variety of ways. But in every case, it is important to have a support base of people who believe in you and your calling. It is very hard to survive as “a loner” in the Kingdom of

God. You can prepare for your future by building a prayer support base now. Keep people informed of your dream and get them to pray with you and for you, for the will of the Lord to be done. Communication is important in this communications age! Build an E-Mail and Postal Mail Prayer Base. This has helped us tremendously – we now have people praying for us, and “The GFM” Ministry, in over 60 nations. They (our prayer supporters) really appreciate knowing what we’re doing, where we’re going and what is developing in our ministry. When people know what you’re doing and are enthused about what you are doing (or genuinely planning to do), they will want to become a part of it.

I repeat: you cannot just sit and wait until it all “drops out of heaven into your lap” with no prior preparation or proving of your gift and calling in God. Rise and let others see that call so they can become part of what God wants to do through you. Gain as much local experience as you can so your calling can be seen, demonstrated and known. If your boat is taking you nowhere, then make the decision to change to the glory of God. He has called you, and He knows exactly how to get you there. **Are you willing to rise up again and follow Him?** He’s waiting for you right NOW. Reach out to Him, and those who believe in you!

**I**f Abraham, Moses, Joshua, Elijah, Elisha, Jonah, John the Baptist, Jesus, Peter, Paul, Joseph and Archippus (and many others) could overcome all the obstacles that confronted them, and they fulfilled their destiny in God, so can you and I! **God’s call CAN be fulfilled – in YOU!** Let me tell you in closing, There is nothing to be compared to fulfilling the call and purpose of God for your life. It is worth everything we have to know that fulfillment, and to see the resulting impact it can have upon multitudes of people in your generation. And it will all be to the glory of God! Plus you will

have an eternal reward as a bonus! God bless you mightily!

*P.S. When we are at home we attend a local Pentecostal Church (“Westside House Of Prayer” in Hamilton) where the Pastor and Leadership Team supports – and networks with - “The GFM” Ministry very positively.*

- Do I dream too small?
- Do I sail too close to the shore?
- Have I lost my thirst for more of Jesus?
- Have I lost my desire for excellence?
- Do I give up too soon?
- Do I settle too far short of the goals I have set?
- Am I disciplined enough to fulfil my dream? My call? My destiny?
- Am I persistent enough?

- Am I maintaining my determination to press on, regardless of the obstacles in the way?
- Am I fueling my passionate pursuit?

It is in honest assessments like these that help us to know where we are wanting/needing to go, and whether we have what it takes to get there. Press on! **You will never be disappointed in the fulfilling of the will of God for your life.**

*“And say to Archippus, See that you discharge carefully [the duties of] the ministry and fulfill the stewardship which you have received in the Lord”*

(Colossians 4:17, AMP).
